



CAPITOL MEETING INSTRUCTIONS

Wednesday, May 15, 2019

For the meetings on Wednesday, please use the Capitol Visitor Center Entrance at the intersection of East Capitol Street and First Street SE (see black arrows on U.S. Capitol Map). The entrance is located beneath the east plaza of the Capitol. This is a short walk from the Capitol South Metro Station.

If there is a long line to enter, go to one of the U.S. Capitol Police standing outside the doors and tell them you are visiting the Capitol on official business. They will be able to move you to the front of the line to expedite the security screening process. Before entering the U.S. Capitol Visitor Center, all visitors are screened by a magnetometer, and all items that are permitted inside the building are screened by an x-ray device.

While certain exceptions for medical needs can be made, the following items are prohibited:

- **Liquid, including water**
- **Food or beverage of any kind, including fruit and unopened packaged food**
- Non-aerosol sprays (Prescriptions for medical needs are permitted.)
- Any bag larger than 18" wide x 14"high x 8.5" deep
- Knives of any size
- Aerosol containers
- Any pointed object, e.g., knitting needles and letter openers. (Pens and pencils are permitted.)
- Electric stun guns, martial arts weapons or devices
- Guns, replica guns, ammunition and fireworks
- Mace and pepper spray
- Razors and box cutters

Once you have gone through security, take a left and you'll be at the House Appointment Desk (see U.S. Capitol Visitor Center map). Tell the attendant at the House Appointment Desk that you are with the Puget Sound Day on the Hill group and present government-issued photo ID. You will get a badge to put on your shirt that says "CVC-217." Walk down the hall behind the appointments desk (you will pass the House Gift Shop on your left), and take the escalator on your right down to the lower level. You'll see the John Swigert statue at the bottom of the escalator. To the right of the statue, proceed down the hallway past the cafeteria on your left and the restrooms on your right, and enter through the large set of doors. Proceed down the hall and CVC-217 will be on your left.


Thursday, May 16, 2018

CAPITOL VISITOR CENTER FLOOR PLAN & MEETING ROOMS


DIRECTIONS FROM SENATE SUBWAY TUNNEL

TO: Congressional Meeting Rooms and Congressional Auditorium

- Upon exiting subway cars, proceed through the first set of doors on the left and into the Capitol Visitor Center. (Do not proceed to the escalator that leads into the Capitol.)
- Continue straight up the ramp, past the Senate Recording Studio on your left. The spiral staircase and skylight will be on your right as you continue straight through the set of bronze doors into the Capitol Visitor Center.
- Turn left immediately and continue down the corridor until you reach an escalator on your right (the Capitol Visitor Center's North Gift Shop will be on your left). Proceed down the escalator to the CVC's lower level.
- Bear left as you exit the escalator, walking past a Senate Appointment Desk and restrooms on your left. Continue straight through the next set of bronze doors. You will now be on a blue carpet. Continue until the end of the corridor and turn right.
- Proceed straight until you reach a central atrium with eight round columns. A large staircase will be on your right. Turn left and proceed down five stairs. A wall with the Pledge of Allegiance engraved in stone will be in front of you. As you approach this wall, turn left or right and into either of the entrances to the Congressional Auditorium.
